On the 24<sup>th</sup> day of March A.D. eighteen hundred and sixty one personally appeared before me Leovida James a Justice of the Peace in and for the County and State the said Leovida James widow of James White dead age 76 years a resident of Mathews County State of Virginia who being duly sworn according to law declare that she is the widow of James White dead who served the full period of sixty days in the Militia Service of the United States in the year 1812 and who was the identical James White who enlisted in Captain Landon's company and after was transferred to Captain Samuel Hughes company 6<sup>th</sup> Regiment commanded by Col Levin Galt in the year 1812 on a mission she does not know she knows that her said husband James White did enlist in the service the first of the war and continued in the service until the close of the war in 1814 and that he was honorably discharged at the close of the war at Mathews County State of Virginia that she has never removed from the County but has moved from one part to another for further information she refers you to his declaration for Land Warrent filed in your office that she was married under the name of Lucy Foster to said James White on the third day of January A.D. 1814 by Rev. William Williams of Mathews County State of Virginia there being no legal barrier to such marriage that the said husband died at Mathews County State of Virginia the third day of December A.D. 1861 and that she has not remarried since his death: that

during the late rebellion against the authority  
of the United States said husband  
in the cause of the enemies of the Government  
said as comfort or exercise the function  
offere whatever under any authority or  
hostility to the United States that she will  
support the Constitution of the United States; that she  
is not in receipt of a pension under any previous  
act, that she make this declaration for the purpose  
of being placed on the pension rolls of the United  
State under the provisions of the act approved February  
14th, 1871, and thereby constitute and appoint said  
full power of substitution and assign William  
S. Jones of Mathews County, State of Virginia  
and lawful attorney to prosecute her claim  
and obtain the pension and fees that may be  
said that his post office is at Mathews County Court  
State of Virginia; that he domicile or place of abode  
is Mathews County, State of Virginia.
